

We are very pleased to welcome a number of schools to our race for the first time: in the Boys race we welcome John Hampden Grammar School (High Wycombe) and Lincroft Middle School (Bedford); and in the Girls race we have Nottingham High School, Upton Hall School FCJ (Wirral), and Walthamstow Hall (Sevenoaks).

There are also several schools returning to compete again this year after a few years' absence, including Dr Challoner's Grammar School, Eltham College, The Skinners School (who last came in 1994!), Uppingham School and Woodland Boys School. Please note however, that Coventry's Tile Hill Wood Girls School and Woodlands Boys School have recently merged, and are now known as West Coventry Academy. For ease of recognition, we have moved their previous records to the new name – so, for years prior to 2017, the Girls results for West Coventry Academy represent Tile Hill Wood's, and the Boys results represent Woodlands'.

A very warm welcome to all of the teams – we have 57 Boys teams and 33 Girls teams coming this year, and so the KHVIII Relay Race should see more runners today than ever before! We are excited to see what you can all do!

What follows is a rough guide to the teams and individuals whom we think will do well in the race today. This is based on information sent by schools, previous form at this Relay, and other events which have taken place earlier on in the XC season. Of course, relays always throw up a few surprises: the complexity of choosing the best order for runners in each team is just one factor to consider. Whilst every effort has been made to get our facts right, any errors are on the part of the programme compilers!

Race identification numbers 01-57 (boys) and 101 - 133 (girls) should be on the runners' vests, and are shown in parentheses after the school's name below. The identification will also show the actual lap for each runner. All spectators are welcome to come to the school hall after the race for the presentations. We hope all competing schools enjoy this year's race and wish all the teams good luck!

Thomasin Kemp – this year's fun find

Looking through the archives, I noticed that in 1998 we had a Thomasin Kemp running for Bryanston School, Dorset. I have managed to contact Thomasin and she has confirmed that, as this was before we had a Girls race, she was allowed to run in the Boys team! Her time of 13:23 put her in the top ten fastest runners. (However, now that we do have a Girls race, we would not expect to see this happen again!)

BOYS

DR CHALLONER'S [06]

After a long break from attending the Relay, we are very pleased to welcome Dr Challoner's School's return this year. They bring with them a sound team, including Will Perkin (Y13), SEAA U20 1500m Champion 2016, and Angus Williams (Y9), third U13 at National Inter Counties XC, and silver medalist at the SEAA U15 3000m Championships.

HIGHGATE [11]

Previously frequent attenders at the race, Highgate return after a break of three years, bringing with them Terry Fawden, an impressive athlete who may well be a contender for this year's fastest lap. Finishing 6th at the ESAA Championship 2k steeplechase last year, taking 3rd place at the Knole Run, and winning the U20 Middlesex Championships, Terry is definitely one to watch.

THE JOHN FISHER SCHOOL [12]

Ricky Lukatome (Y12) returns again to the Relay for the third time this year with the John Fisher team, having once again run a great season, continuing to improve his PBs on the track and XC. He gained his U17 England vest last March, and finished 4th in the Schools International XC in Edinburgh. Over the summer Ricky recorded an impressive 1.52.9 over 800m (shaving almost 4 seconds off last year), and finished 2nd in

the Kings Trophy in October. In the last couple of weeks, he has retained his Surrey County Championship U17 title, finished 5th in the Knole Run, and once again picked up the fastest leg in a high quality field in the Goater Cup at HABS. With the 5th best time here last year, Ricky is another in a growing field of truly impressive athletes competing here today.

THE JUDD [15]

First place last year, and the year before, and placing 1st or 2nd for the last nine years, the Judd consistently provide extremely strong competition for this race. Winning the St Albans Relay, and taking 2nd place again at the 2016 Knole Run, this year's team fields competitors largely new to the Relay this year, with the exceptions of Jess Magorrian (Y12), who has competed three times before, and Isaac Harding (who placed 26th at Knole, and raced in Judd B last year). The newer team members are all strong athletes: James Kingston (Y10), who placed 4th in the Kent Championships, 6th in the U15 ESAA Cup, and 12th at Knole; Jamie Bingham, placing 25th at Knole, and Adam Van der Plas and Toby Emm, placing 16th & 19th in the ESAA U15 Cup.

KING HENRY VIII [18]

KHVIII are pleased this year to be fielding two Boys teams, and having worked hard to add greater depth to their runners. Ollie Graham and George Gawthorpe (Y10) are the ones to watch this year; George in particular, has a few years yet to develop, and he has the potential to be an outstanding athlete if he continues to pursue the sport. As ever, thanks to all of our runners for their help with organising the Relay.

LOUGHBOROUGH GS [21]

Veterans of this race, placing fourth last year, Loughborough hope to be fielding their formidable Ben Djikstra. Olympic youth triathlon champion and GB junior representative at the World Championships in Mexico 2015, and multi-winner of English schools titles, including the XC, track and field (3000m), Ben brings great experience to the competition. This last season has seen some injuries for Ben, so Loughborough are hoping that their strong team will have him fit and able to race today.

LINCROFT [20]

A very warm welcome to Lincroft Middle School on their debut performance at the race. As they are a middle school with no senior students, they will be a young team, but that shouldn't make other competitors too comfortable – they placed 9th at the ESAA 2016 Cup, and they are certainly a team to watch out for!

MARLING [24]

Frequent competitors at the Relay, this year Marling bring a strong contender for fastest lap, Tom Middleton. The British road race / mini-marathon champion, this year he took the fastest lap at St Albans in November, setting a new course record, and then went on in December to comfortably win the ESAA Cup, 40 seconds clear of his nearest competitor. He is in the top 30 in the world for U18 rankings, and just last week competed at the Annual Cross Internacional Juan Muguerza, a European athletics meet where he placed 4th (in a team with Relay veteran Sam Stevens of Loughborough, who took 2016's fastest lap here).

SEDBERGH [32]

After a very close finish last year, the Judd just inching Sedburgh into second place, this school will be champing at the bit to take the title this year. We look forward to seeing what happens!

SHREWSBURY [35]

Retaining the Knole Run title this year – extending their victory over the Judd by a convincing 70 points, this time – Shrewsbury's Hunt are looking like the ones to beat in 2017.

ST COLUMBAS [45]

A solid performer in XC, St Columba's College return with George Groom once again, hoping to get back into the top ten after some great showings at the Relay in previous years. An outstanding athlete and former U15 national XC champion, George (Y12) enjoyed a strong summer season taking the AAA's 1500m

steeplechase title, and was selected to run the 2000m SC for Great Britain at the European Youth Championships in Tbilisi, Georgia. George also competed in the U20 age group, winning the European Club Championship 3000m SC in Spain. A few weeks ago, George proved he's still on top form, claiming the U17 Hertfordshire AAA XC championship, alongside his classmate Kristian Imroth, winning the U15 title.

WEST COVENTRY ACADEMY (WOODLANDS) [58]

Returning for the first time in ten years, we are delighted to welcome them back, who bring with them Ryan Hand (Y7) and Jack Harrison (Y11), both strong XC competitors. Ryan and Jack took 1st and 2nd place at the West Midlands XC Championships in January, and will be running in the ESAA Championships in March. We look forward to seeing what WCA can do!

GIRLS

BROMSGROVE [102]

For the third year in a row, Bromsgrove bring Abbie Saker with them. Coming from strong running stock (her father Andrew Saker holds a fastest lap time of 11.12 for the Relay from 1982!) Abbie has had a great 2016 season, as County Schools XC champion and winner of the 3000m title here and in the Midlands Championship. She took fastest leg at Midlands Road Relays, where her team won first place, and came 6th in the Midland Cross Country Championships. She also placed 24th in the London Mini Marathon, and 11th in the English 3000m Championships.

KING HENRY VIII [105]

Charlotte Cleasby and Louisa Woolley both return this year as part of the KHVIII team; Charlotte has had a tough year with injury, but we are hoping she can make a return to form, and show some really good competition at the Relay this time. As ever, thanks to all of our runners for their help with organising the Relay.

LOUGHBOROUGH HS [109]

Loughborough took a convincing third place at the Relay last year, and always bring a strong challenge, having held 1st or 2nd place for six of their previous seven years attending the Relay. Can they do it again?

MILLFIELD SCHOOL [110]

After their third place glory in 2016, we are watching Millfield closely again this year.

SEDBERGH [118]

Fielding three teams this year, and taking a strong 5th place at the 2016 Relay, Sedbergh are looking like they are on top form this season. Can they challenge Loreto for the top spot this time?

SEVENOAKS [121]



Liz Yelling King Henry VIII Relay Race 2017 Guest Speaker

Liz Yelling is one of Britain's best ever endurance runners. Two-time Olympic Marathon runner, with a London Marathon PB of 2:28.33 in 2008 (ranking in the UK all time top 10 women's results), Liz competed in the Olympic Games in Athens and Beijing, and has been to two Commonwealth Games, winning a bronze medal in the marathon in Melbourne, 2006.

Liz has run all her life: an international athlete between the ages of 15 and 35, she has won multiple national titles on the roads, track and cross country, including the National XC title 4 times! She has team Gold medals from the European Championships, and a Bronze medal from the World Cross Country Championships, finishing as the top European runner there. Liz won her first national title at the English



Schools Track 1500m, and subsequently pursued athletics (coached by Alec Stanton), and her dream of Olympic glory.

Liz is now an athletics coach, helping double Paralympic Gold medalist Richard Whitehead to glory in London and Rio, as well as advising many nervous first timers and improving marathoners to personal bests. Liz supports the next generation of British talent in her role as team manager for the Junior Women's Great Britain XC team (including KHVIII's Relay Race competitors Harriet Knowles-Jones, Sabrina Sinha and Mari Smith), pictured below.

In 2015, Liz was awarded an Honorary Doctorate from the Bournemouth University for her contribution to health initiatives, running and the local community, and she is a patron of Dorset charity *Julia's House Hospice*, supporting children with life-limiting illness. Liz is a life member of Bedford and County AC, and ardent supporter of local running initiatives, such as parkrun. Married to Martin Yelling (also a road and cross



country national athlete), Liz is a mum of three, with a daughter and twin boys.

Cross country is Liz's first running love, and she has competed at ten world XC Championships. We are absolutely delighted that she can join us today, and share some of her passion, experience and commitment to the sport with us, at the 46th KHVIII Relay Race.
