It has been a bit of a surreal few weeks with the current issues going on all around us. However, you would not know



it by the attitudes of the children, who are still coming in to school happy and excited for the day. With the weather that bit milder (and to get out in the fresh air as much as possible) Reception have been enjoying the outdoor



area. We have had chalk drawing, water painting, finger painting, grocery shopping, planting and much more. Take a look at how much fun we've been having.

Our fairytale story for this week has been 'Goldilocks and the three bears'. We heard lots of different retellings of the story and discussed how fairytales are not always retold in exactly the same way but the main storyline is kept the same. We spotted some of the differences and talked about which versions we liked the best. Taking this into account and after really familiarizing ourselves with the story, we decided to write our own versions. The children



made sure they included their typical fairytale starter.... 'Once upon a time' 'Once' 'One day'.... and a happy ending too. We spread our writing out over the week to ensure we added detail to each part of the story. The teachers were all very impressed with the sentence writing we saw.



In Maths this week we have been learning about estimation and started with a definition of what it means—'having a good guess'. We talked about how these guesses don't have to be exact. They are instead a rough idea. We made towers of bricks and estimated how tall they were, then checked our answers by counting. We then built a tower with a known number of bricks and used this tower to help us make well thought out estimates of the number of bricks in other towers. We thought about whether the other towers were bigger or smaller and therefore whether the number of bricks would be more or less. Following on from this we had various containers filled with items for the children to make estimates on. We asked them to explain their choice of numbers with a partner, encouraging their use of reasoning skills.

We are disappointed we could not continue with the Mother's Day assembly. The children had worked hard learning the songs and their lines too. We hope to do something soon for you mums in the coming months but in the meantime enjoy your special day. Take some much deserved time for you!

Finally, despite it being the right decision to keep everyone safe, we are sad to be closing for the coming weeks and will miss all the children. They are the reason we want to come in to work every day! Remember to keep in contact with us. This week began with discussions surrounding the great importance of handwashing and cleanliness, in light of the current situation. The children conducted an experiment




using water, soap and pepper! They were amazed to find the pepper granules, which we pretended were germs, floating away as the soap entered the water. The
