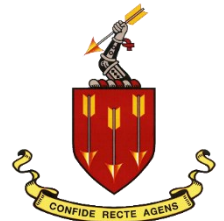

Literacy

We introduced the letter 'a' this week and the children have tried very hard to go "around the apple and down the leaf". It is important that they get the formation right at a young age because bad habits are hard to undo!



Numeracy

We used ink to count out the right amount of fingerprints to match the numeral on the caterpillars head. This is tricky as it involves careful and meaningful counting. They all tried hard. We also made "square monsters", as a reminder of the shape. The children loved these and I hope they do remember the shape name!

It was particularly nice to see children being incorporated into several different friendship sets.



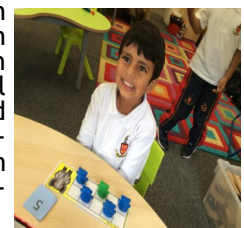
In this week's work, we have been thinking about our senses. We thought about our ears, eyes and nose, what we use them for and how we look after them. The children went on a scavenger hunt to focus on the sense of 'touch'. Their mission was to find as many different textures as possible. Later in the week, we moved on to 'taste and smell'. We put our tasting skills to the test to see whether we could identify a food with our eyes shut. Strangely, we were very good at guessing chocolate correctly!



Literacy, saw us continue to learn our Read Write Inc. sounds and perfect our 'Fred talk'. Linking with our topic work, we read 'Funny bones' and ordered the pictures from the story. Many children were able to order six pictures in total, which was fabulous! With rhyming being a fundamental skill, we looked at words that had the same ending sounds. To challenge ourselves further, we even tried to carry on rhyming patterns, rat, cat, sat, bat etc.



Maths work has been focusing on strengthening our understanding of the relationship of numbers and what they 'look' like. Calculating 'one more than', we have been learning what that means on a number line, counting by rote and practically too.



Parent's meetings have been taking place this week and we hope you found them useful. We have all be adapting to new technology and ways of communicating and although we did not get to meet in the dining hall as per usual, it was good to discuss your child's progress and help with any concerns.
