Please read below some of the key points from this policy which you may need to consider as part of your application.

It is recognised that the judgements about what sacrifices a family should make to pay school fees will be personal and the level of awards is therefore not rigid. The award of a bursary is specifically to allow a child whose parents may not otherwise be able to afford tuition fees to benefit from a place at our school. The award is not intended to support a pre-existing lifestyle. The Governors therefore consider that the following would not be consistent with the award of a bursary:

1. Household income (gross income) in excess of £65,000
2. Net assets should not exceed £300,000
3. Substantial savings or investments of more than £60,000
4. Receipt of any means-tested State Benefit
5. If only one parent is employed (unless one is prevented from doing so through incapacity)
6. More than one property
7. Investment in significant home improvements
8. Mortgages on excessively expensive properties
9. Substantial equity in homes
10. Frequent or expensive holidays
11. New or luxury cars

SCHOLARSHIPS AT 11+

A number of Academic, Music and Art Scholarships are available for Shells (Year 7) entry. The award of these scholarships will be based on the ability of the child and their performance in the examination and at interview. All Scholarship interviews/auditions will take place in November. A Scholarship award may be supplemented by a bursary award in appropriate cases.

11+ ART SCHOLARSHIP

It is expected that candidates who wish to be considered for an Art Scholarship will show considerable natural ability and will have begun to reach high standards of proficiency in their creative work in terms of technique, development of ideas and their understanding of the subject. We will be looking for enthusiastic individuals who make the subject a major part of not only their school life but also their free time, and are able to respond to the creative possibilities of the subject.

Candidates are asked to submit a portfolio of recent work. The work submitted should contain evidence of sound observational drawing skills, but might also include creative textiles, sculpture, photography or a range of other craft activities, which may have been created in school or in a candidates' own time. Preparatory work and sketch books can also be submitted. After the work has been inspected, a shortlist of candidates will be invited to take part in a practical observed drawing exercise and a short interview with their portfolio of work. Inclusion on the shortlist will be dependent upon the necessary academic standards being met. An award is tenable to the end of the pupil's time in the School, but will be subject to annual review. We stress that the award of a scholarship does not wholly depend on work produced on this day and we do not want candidates to be intimidated by the interview process in any way. At interview the candidates will be encouraged to talk about their work, artistic experiences and aspirations as well as evidence of widening interests.

11+ MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

Awards are given for instrumental or vocal accomplishment alone, but candidates must reach the minimum academic standard to qualify for admission to the School. An award is tenable to the end of the pupil's time in the School, but will be subject to annual review. We expect pupils to have attained or be working towards a standard of **Grade 4 ABRSM** or equivalent on at least one instrument, normally an orchestral instrument.

Music Scholars are expected to involve themselves fully in the co-curricular activities of the Music department whilst also maintaining high standards of individual performance. Membership of at least two instrumental groups is expected and all scholars will be asked to sing in one of the choirs. There is also an expectation that Music Scholars will take Music to GCSE level and possibly continue to study Music in the Sixth Form. Candidates who are strong in other school subjects may also be considered for an Academic Scholarship. Candidates may offer one or more instruments or voice. There is no written Music paper. A shortlist of candidates will be invited to an interview/audition in which they will be encouraged to talk generally about their musical experience and aspirations, and to demonstrate knowledge of rudiments as well as evidence of widening interests.
