

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Why King Henry VIII Sixth Form?

Academic Excellence

King Henry VIII garnered their best results in several years with an impressive 24% of all grades at A* in 2022, with 79% of our students achieving A*-B grades. The majority of our students aspire to continue their studies at university, with a wide and interesting range of degrees selected. Over half our students study at Russell Group universities on leaving King Henry VIII School and we enjoy yearly success with Oxbridge. Other students want to explore different routes - one secured a prestigious apprenticeship with IBM this year, and others decided to embark on an exciting gap year.

Expert Teaching

All our classes are taught by teachers who are not only highly-qualified specialist staff but also passionate about their subject. Class sizes are small allowing for personalised learning experiences. To support academic progress we identify students for individual and small group mentoring schemes to help them reach their potential.

Careers Guidance and Oxbridge

Our professionally qualified Head of Careers offers extensive support throughout the two years of VI Form. Alongside this our Oxbridge Coordinator, form tutors, and subject teachers support students through the process of applying to Oxford and Cambridge including coaching and administering entrance tests.



Co-Curricular

We have excellent co-curricular provision which shapes well-rounded individuals. These include fantastic opportunities in music and sport as well as the Extended Project Qualification, Gold DofE, Young Enterprise, Young Engineers, and MEDSOC. We also offer leadership and collaboration opportunities in fundraising, peer support, student council and events management.

Pastoral Care

We are a supportive community that is typified by the superb pastoral care and tutor support they experience daily, including individual support from the Sixth Form Learning Mentor. We value our students and their talents with Academic, Sports, and Music Scholarships available.

Unique Facilities

We are fortunate to have a purpose-built Sixth Form Centre with its own garden and café. On the main school site there is a 25m swimming pool and a state-of-the-art gym. We are also in close proximity to various forms of public transport and the town centre.

Enriched Academic Path at King Henry VIII School

At King Henry VIII School Sixth Form, we have designed an enriched academic path borne of the high ambition and aspiration we share with our students and parents.

For most this will consist of a choice of three A Levels from a broad range of subjects, plus the Extended Project Qualification (EPQ).

is This complemented curriculum enhancements through Extended Studies, guided Private Study, independent study periods, Games, Community Service, and a programme of Personal, Social Health Education. and Some students will study four A Levels and undertake the EPQ in Upper VI.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL AND **HEALTH EDUCATION**

1 period per week, but also through form time, assemblies, and consultations, with focus upon helping students develop the knowledge, skills and attributes needed to make positive choices and navigate the demands of modern life both now and in the future.

A LEVEL PROGRAMME


Most students follow three A Levels, delivered through six periods per subject per week. Students choose any three A Levels from those available (see contents page: A Level Subjects at King Henry VIII School). We do not have pre-determined subject combinations and endeavour to manipulate the timetable around student choices.*

EXTENDED PROJECT QUALIFICATION

Two periods per week: Generally studied in Lower VI. Please see page 33 for more information.

GAMES AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

Two periods per week; students can represent King Henry VIII School in team sports such as Rugby, Hockey, Netball, Cricket, Athletics and Cross Country. The multisport option includes Basketball, Handball, Dodgeball, Swimming, Table Tennis, Badminton and much more, whilst students can also choose ice-skating. Community Service involves supporting local primary schools or working in charitable organisations.



INDEPENDENT STUDIES

Seven periods per week. Private study is an essential part of the Sixth Form provision, therefore in order to encourage positive study habits, students will complete some time in supervised study sessions with our dedicated student manager.

EXTENDED STUDIES

1 period per week: A broad programme of enrichment options. Recent options have included: Philosophy; Italian; Maths for Biologists; Young Enterprise: Modern Dance: First Aid, and Self-defence. Options change yearly.

^{*}Every effort is made to ensure each course runs but with such a broad range on offer reduced lesson allocation may be introduced if student numbers drop below five and in very rare cases low take-up may mean a course is not viable. The usual group size ranges from five to 14. We have additional flexibility with subjects at A level by sharing the teaching of a small number of subjects with Bablake School.

A Level Art allows you to develop an exciting and extensive range of creative and technical skills. Unique to studying Art at A Level, you build up a very personal and continually evolving body of practical work, guided and supported by your teachers. Individual exploration and development of your personal skills and creative directions is a special aspect of this subject.

A Level Art prepares you to produce two major pieces of assessed work. The first is a Personal Investigation, which allows you to devise and put together a personal body of creative coursework, including extensive practical work, a 3,000 word illustrated essay and a fully developed and resolved Final Piece Project. You do this without time limits, during the course.

The second practical component is a themed set task known as the Timed Test. Previous themes include: Circles and Curves; Backstage – The Theatre; Architectural Façades. This is given on the 1st of February in Upper VI. Students have three months to work extensively on their chosen theme, and then sit a timed test over three days for a total of 15 hours to create and complete a personal, creative Final Piece.



At A Level, students have the opportunity to work for 'live clients', encouraging a greater depth and understanding of the important role Design & Technology plays in every part of our lives. This also encourages students to produce commercial quality projects, engage collaboratively with professionals and work to the tight deadlines that they will experience in university and employment.

Throughout the course, the students will develop their analytical skills and they are encouraged to broaden and deepen their understanding through practical and theoretical study. At KS5, they are encouraged to make full use of modern materials and technology, including the use of 3D printing for rapid prototype work. The design process followed mirrors that which is used in industry to allow the students to understand fully how professional designers and engineers work.

The opportunities following a Design qualification are endless. Whether you choose to take an Engineering route or follow a more creative path, the background understanding of complex design approaches to problem solving are entirely transferable to any walk of life.

Extended Project Qualification



The Extended Project Qualification (EPQ) is a highly enriching and engaging opportunity for students to research a topic of their choice. Based on this research students then either present their findings as an extended essay or create an artefact with accompanying report. Previous essays have focused upon robotics in medicine, equality in sport, and the sustainability of biodegradable polymers. Examples of recent artefacts include a crossbow, guitar, and a bench made from upcycled snowboards.

EPQ builds independent learning skills such as planning and research, whilst also fostering critical and original thinking. For these reasons it is highly regarded by both employers and universities. Each EPQ is unique to each student, so it is a fantastic talking point at interviews and helps our students stand out from the crowd. The process culminates in a presentation evening which is always a wonderful celebration of the students' work.

Oxford and Cambridge

The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge collectively known as Oxbridge are amongst the oldest and most prestigious universities in the world. It is therefore unsurprising that entry is so highly competitive. Every year pupils from Henry's have gained places through a combination of outstanding academic achievement in GCSEs, well written applications and references, excellence in admissions tests, strong performance at interview and finally stellar A Level results.

The staff at Henrys are used to helping students through this daunting process. We offer support and mock exams for the aptitude tests such as the Thinking Skills Assessment (TSA) and Biomedical Admissions Test (BMAT). There is a mock interview evening with staff from other schools and local universities. The hard work is done by the pupils, but the staff are able to provide guidance and support along the way to enable students to work in a targeted a productive way. In recent years students have gained places for Physics, Natural Sciences, Medicine, English and Mathematics.



Supervised Study Support



As you enter the Sixth Form, it will be the first time in your school career that you will not have timetabled lessons for the whole of your school day. Private study is an essential part of the Sixth Form provision, therefore in order to encourage positive study habits, students will complete some time in supervised study sessions with our dedicated student manager.

The step up from GCSE to Sixth Form work is significant and can be daunting. Independent study is an essential skill that students have to master in order to be completely successful; it is the difference between study at GCSE and A Level. It is important students start working at the required level early in Lower VI and we aim for 20 hours of independent work each week, this includes homework.

Our student manager will work closely with you to help develop the disciplines and skills required and will design a study plan, which incorporates both the required number of hours of study and commitments/ co-curricular activities a student may have. Ongoing support and mentoring is always available to help overcome barriers or issues and students have access to numerous tools and strategies to help them study effectively.

Co-Curricular at King Henry VIII School

Our co-curriculum is exceptional: you can develop new interests, deepen your subject knowledge, let off steam, take responsibility, show initiative and take the lead. We want our students to become resilient, confident, charming adults and citizens, and we know that it takes more than an exclusively academic curriculum to achieve that. We offer an extremely diverse range of co-curricular activities in which every student plays a part.



Sport

Our sports provision is extensive and caters for sportsmen and women at all levels. We have a large number of elite participants who represent their county, region and even country and also run clubs and competitions for those playing socially and maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

Outdoor Education

We are very proud of our Outdoor Education program at King Henry VIII School, which includes the opportunity for students to pursue their Gold Duke of Edinburgh Award, either as a continuation to their Bronze or Silver, or as a direct gold entry participant.

Leadership Opportunities

There is tremendous scope for leadership within the school community and King Henry VIII School Sixth Form students are encouraged to apply for the most prestigious roles of their school career. During this time students develop most importantly their collaborative skills; managing, directing and inspiring a team to accomplish positive results. Elections take place during the Lower Sixth for Head Boy, Head Girl and their Deputies.

Also, there is the opportunity to hold prominent posts such as Senior Prefect, House Captain, Senior Librarian or member of the Core Council, Peer Support or Social Committee. These positions of responsibilities are the highest ambassadorial roles for our Sixth Formers and each student thrives and develops personal attributes beyond their expectation.

PSHE is an important and integral part of the Sixth Form curriculum and we have a comprehensive two year programme. Themes are covered during an extended form period encompassing aspects of personal, social and health education.

Careers Support in the Sixth Form

Careers education, information, advice and guidance (CEIAG) is an essential part of the support we offer to our sixth form students at King Henry VIII School. Effective careers support can help to prepare young people for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of life; it can help them to make decisions and manage transitions as learners and workers. As options for young people become more varied and complex, it is vital that we support them to develop the knowledge and skills they need to make informed choices for their future.

Mrs Sally Pike is a qualified and experienced Careers Adviser who will provide engaging one to one careers advice, guidance and support to all sixth formers, giving students positive direction for post-school choices.

With many of our students applying to university, Mrs Pike offers advice and feedback on Personal Statement writing for the UCAS application, and organises practice mock interviews to the year group in Upper Sixth.

The School boasts an excellent Careers Library containing information on hundreds of careers. There is an impressive set of guides to support Higher Education choices, and advice on making UCAS applications. Other books provide information on Gap Year opportunities, study abroad, student funding, and information on graduate destinations. There is an expanding section on current Degree Apprenticeships as well.

Sixth Form Admissions

The deadline for Sixth Form applications for external candidates is Wednesday 24 January 2024. The application form will ask you to make your subject choices along with any Academic, Music, Sport or Bursary applications. All applicants will be invited to interview in February 2024 (dates will be communicated nearer the time).

Following a successful interview and satisfactory reference from your current school, a conditional offer may be made based on predicted GCSE grades or international equivalents.

Our entry requirements are as follows:

5 GCSE grade 6s, with Grade 7s preferred in those subjects being taken at A Level. Some subjects require a grade 7, including Biology, Chemistry, Maths and Physics. Further Maths requires a Grade 8.

For subjects that are new at A level, such as Law and Business, specific grades are required at GCSE in subjects which have related skills.

In addition, students who want to study four subjects at A Level must have an average of at least 7.5 across all GCSE subjects.

Offers are confirmed once GCSE results have been published.

Please note current King Henry Year 11 students do not need to apply for Sixth Form entry.

Academic Scholarship

Applicants should be capable of, and on course to achieve, grade of at least 8 and 9 in all subjects at GCSE that are intended for Sixth Form Study, as demonstrated by the predicted grades provided by their present school. Students should have made a full contribution to the life of their current school.

Music Scholarship

Students applying for a Music Scholarship should be able to demonstrate a wide involvement in music-making within their present school and ideally in the wider community. Successful candidates will be expected to show ability and enthusiasm to take a leading role in the musical activities of the school.

Sport Scholarship

Applicants must have the academic ability to succeed within the Sixth Form and be able to demonstrate a wide-ranging contribution to school sport in two or more sporting activities.

Bursaries

Bursaries are awarded to pupils whose parents are unable to pay the full school fees. These awards are designed to assist those pupils who have demonstrated the potential to benefit from the education and opportunities provided by King Henry VIII School and who would actively contribute to the ethos and community spirit within the school.

Parents wishing to apply for a Bursary should tick the appropriate box on the main Application Form and will then receive a Bursary Form on which to submit financial details in confidence.
