# **WELCOME**



**King Henry VIII School** extends a very warm welcome to all the teams attending the 2024 Race. This year, 62 Boys teams and 42 Girls teams have entered the competition. It's always a tremendous privilege to host this national event, with teams coming from all over the UK to race together—and this year, we're especially excited to welcome teams from as far abroad as Northern Ireland, joining us to compete in the 52nd Boys Race and the 24th Girls Race, here in Coventry.

As many of you will already know, former alumni of the race have set British and world records, won Olympic medals, and other garlands of victory in athletics, and it's always great to see records being smashed, and new personal and team bests being recorded.

As well as many long-standing Relay Race veteran schools returning to compete, we are very pleased to have yet more brand-new schools attending for the first time this year: **St Michael's College** from Enniskillen; **New Hall School**, Chelmsford; and more local schools, **Princethorpe College** and **Loughborough College**—to all of whom we extend a warm welcome. Relative newcomers **Stonyhurst College** are also bringing a girls team for the first time. Last year a number of schools were unable to attend due to strike action, and we are very pleased to have these teams back on the starting line this year. As always, we wish the very best of luck to all the runners in this year's Relay, and look forward to seeing some great sportsmanship and teamwork from everyone.

What follows is a rough guide to the teams and individuals whom we think will do well in the race today, as well as comments and background on schools who have performed notably in the past. This is based on information sent by schools, previous form at this Relay, and other events which have taken place earlier on in the XC season. We note that, increasingly, Relay competitors have profiles on the *Power of 10* website—it's wonderful to see athletes of exceptional calibre racing here, in teams from all over the country. As ever, be warned—relays always throw up a few surprises: the complexity of choosing the best order for runners in each team is just one factor to consider. Whilst every effort has been made to get our facts right, any errors are on the part of the programme compilers!

Vest identification numbers 01–62 (boys) and 101–142 (girls) are shown in parentheses after the school's name below. The identification will also show the actual lap for each runner, with the final-leg runner's number coloured blue. All spectators are welcome to come to the school after the race, to enjoy the presentations.

# **TEAM PROFILES & RUNNERS TO WATCH**

## **BOYS**

## **BROMSGROVE** [04]

After a brief absence last year, we're pleased to see Bromsgrove back again as long-standing competitors in the Race. This time they bring with them William Pridden (Y12), whose form has been steadily improving, and over the last few years has moved into triathlon. William was selected this year to be part of the U18 England Triathlon squad, coming second in the finals of the British Championships, and 3rd overall in the series.

#### CALDAY GRANGE [05] [06]

After taking second and fourth place for the Boys Race in the last two years respectively—both outstandingly competitive fields—Calday Grange promise good racing for us today.

#### JUDD [18] [19]

Judd return as reigning Boys' Team champions for the last three years in a row, with an impressive history of eight wins in total, and having held a top-five position since 2008. Always an outstanding performance, last year Judd broke the all-time course record, with an incredible time of 69.05! Surely they can't top it this year? We're excited to see the team Coach Simon Fraser brings for 2024, who go into the Race in good form. A close second in the National Cup Final has been their only defeat of the season thus-far, and earlier this month they made it a record-extending sixth Knole Run triumph. Many of the squad have good memories of this Coventry course: Captain Tom Claridge, second at the Knole, ran 11:20 last year; Josh Prendergast has dipped below 12 minutes three times before, and George Hopkins, twice. Jack Sharpe has probably been the most improved and will look to match his top-20 performance from the Cup Final. Other contenders for the A-team include Mark Bridger, Tom Beghein, Ethan Rocks, and Oliver Head, whilst their B-team could include several of their National Cup-winning Intermediate team.

#### KING HENRY VIII [20]

Returning for his fourth Relay is Douglas Garnett (Y11), Doug had a top 10 finish in his first U17 race for the West Midlands Schools at the English Schools National XC Champs in March 2023. Following this in June he came 3rd in the West Mids Athletic Champs in the 1500, represented West Mids at the inter counties Mason Trophy in the 1500, and finished in the top 15 of the U17 Mens Midlands XC Champs. Last summer, Doug secured a bronze medal at the International Childrens Games in the 1500 in Daegu, South Korea. The team spans Year 7 to Year 13, so there are both seasoned athletes and developing runners competing for Henry's today.

# **SHREWSBURY** [39] [40]

A long-standing competitor at the Relay, knowing the course extremely well, Shrewsbury took second place in 2023. Returning this year with the squad is Jack Kinrade: fastest U16 in the world for 800m (1:51.72), U17 UK no 1 for 800m, two times National Champion, holding seven national medals, and running a sub-50 second 400m in 2022, Jack has been consistently ranked at the top of the national standings for 800m. Let's see what Shrewsbury can do in this year's Race.

## ST ALBANS [42] [43]

St Albans haven't missed a Relay since 1973, and have won the Race a dozen times. This year Ben Gostick returns as a captain with valuable experience. Ben has had a hugely impressive season in regional and national team events, placing in the top 20 at both the Nationals and Knole Run, and represents GB in orienteering.

### ST ANSELMS [46] [47]

St Anselms have competed in the Relay almost every year since 1977, just five years from the Race's inception. This year they are fielding a strong team, including Michael Phelan (Y9) who finished in 6<sup>th</sup> place at the ESAA National Finals this year, and Jac Chapman (Y10), George Goulding (Y10),

Michael Merriman (Y10) and Malachi Harty (Y9) who had a team 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish at the ESAA National Finals.

#### ST MICHAEL'S [48]

First-time competitors in the Relay, we are thrilled that St Michael's College from Enniskillen are attending this year—they're travelling such a distance that they arrived here yesterday, and now are hopefully refreshed and ready to enjoy a great race today. They are a strong team, most of whom have represented Ireland in SIAB schools XC, or track & field events; Frank Buchanan (Irish Schools 3000m champion and Commonwealth Youth Games 1500m finalist) and Sean Corry Irish Schools XC and

800m champion) stand out in particular. Welcome St Michael's!

St Michael's College XC Team, who travelled over 350 miles to be here today!



#### WOODBRIDGE [60]

Still relative newcomers to the Relay, Woodbridge hosted the National Final of the English Schools XC Cup in December, fielding three qualifying teams; their Junior Boys taking 4th place, many of whom are running today. Also in their team is Henry Dover, who has had an excellent 2022/23. After winning Inter Boys 1500 at English Schools, SIAB International Inter Boys 1500 in Belfast (setting a meeting record), the U17 English National 3000 (breaking a 42-year record) and the London Mini Marathon in 2022, Henry's 2023 was just as impressive, winning the U17 National XC, bronze at UK Inter Counties XC and team gold, and winning the U20 Liverpool Cross Challenge. Henry has been selected to represent Great Britain at the European XC Championship, finished 6th at the Europeans, and won team silver with Great Britain. (In 2022, Henry ran 8:15 for U17 3000, now 5th on the UK all-time list—6th on that list now reads Mo Farah!)

# **GIRLS**

### JUDD [105]

The Judd Girls go into this race delighted with their best ever result, having just won the Knole Run. Captain Carys Firth placed second individually, and will be hoping for a top-10 split here. Jess Poland also returns to this course in good form. They will be joined by two new members of the team, who hope to better last year's sixth place finish.

### KING HENRY VIII [106] [107]

Hattie Garnett (Y12) captains the Girls for Henry's this year, fielding a capable A team of Lucy McQueen, Rose Andrews and Marta Haas, and backed up by an increasingly strong B team, comprising Clarissa Young, Freya Rendle, Freya Robson, and Lauren Hughes. As captain, Hattie sets a fantastic

pattern for her teammates, both in great support and encouragement, and also in her own pursuit of athletic achievement. She has been selected to run for West Midlands Schools at the English Schools National XC Champs in March, and represented Warwickshire last March at the Inter Counties XC; Hattie competed in her first 10km at the Northbrook 10km in July, winning the U20 Womens category.

#### **NEW HALL [115]**

New Hall join us for the first time in 2024, as part of their coach Sebastian Cirillo's determined efforts to increase the XC fixtures for their very capable athletes. They arrive excited and ready for the Relay challenge, bringing with them Olivia Forrest (Y10), who represented England XC last year, placing year 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 3000 and 5<sup>th</sup> in the 5000 respectively in the UK U15. Welcome New Hall!

#### RATCLIFFE COLLEGE [120] [121]

Following on from the success of last year's young team coming second, Ratcliffe College return for the third time to Race, another year older and stronger! Team captain, Shai King, holds the title of third fastest girl ever to run the course; she has had another year of impressive results, including winning the U17 English National XC Champs and coming first in the SIAB International 800. As last year, Shai will be supported by Violet Rudkin, who gained a silver medal in the 1500 at the English Schools Athletics Championships; Luan Power, who won bronze in the Midland Counties XC Champs takes the 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the team; and final place is taken by Matilda Don, who came 4<sup>th</sup> in the National Year 7 XC Champs. Once again, the team is hugely excited to take part.

#### UPTON HALL SCHOOL FCJ [137] [138]

Taking third place last year, thereby winning the Pat Head Bowl, we look forward to seeing what Upton Hall can do this year. Gabby Phelan was selected to represent England in the Welsh International in the summer for the 2000 steeplechase, which she went onto win, as well as the English Schools 1500 steeplechase. Holly Cross was selected for Great Britain for the World Biathlete Championships in Bali where her team finished in 1st place and she finished 5th overall.

When we approached this year's VIP Chris Finill, to ask him to attend the 2024 Race and present the prizes, we only knew that he was a seasoned athlete with some very impressive records under his belt—but we quickly learned that, in fact, Chris was a member of Harrow County School's 1975 team! Chris has been able to shed some light on some of our archive photographs, and fill in a little more

history on our longstanding and beloved Relay, which already has a wealth of stats and trivia for veterans to enjoy...

This is the team photo that we shared with Chris, all we knew was that it was the "1972 Harrow CS" (we used it in our 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary programme in 2022). Chris was able to tell us that Robert Heath (third from left, front row) is the current Harrow AC Treasurer. Derek Wolfe (left, front row) on occasions beat Kirk Dumpleton from St Albans, who won the English Schools Intermediate XC title in 1972, beating both Steve Ovett (2nd) and Sebastian Coe (10th) in that race.



(Ovett and Coe are both major figures in GB athletics history; Steve Ovett won gold for 800 at the 1980 Olympics, and set five world records for the 1500 and mile distances. Seb Coe is probably even better known, winning Olympic gold for the 1500 in 1980 and 1984, setting nine outdoor and three indoor middle distance records, and vice president and then president of the IAAF (now World Athletics) from 2007—and of course, holder of the KHVIII Relay Race fastest lap time for 1975!)

It's his tea ticket from the day (does the fact that he still has it means Gareth went without sandwiches after the race?) 




## VIP Guest, Chris Finill

Chris was born in the same street in Harrow as Roger Bannister (first athlete to break the four-minute mile, in 1954), so he had an instant association with athletics. Joining Harrow Athletic Club in 1974, he started competing regularly for his school, Harrow County Grammar School, and then for Middlesex at the English Schools.

Chris clearly remembers competing in the King Henry Relays in 1975, recalling that in '75, the fastest lap was run by a young Sebastian Coe (who is now President of the International Association of Athletics Federations!)

Always wanting to run just that little bit further, Chris progressed from 10k crosscountry races to his first marathon in the USA aged 20, whilst studying at Michigan State University. From there, he moved up



the distances to 100 kilometres (62 miles) and then 24-hour races. In both events he became English Champion, and went on to represent Great Britain, eventually gaining a total of 14 international vests.



Still curious to test his limits and seek further adventure, Chris ran across America, from San Francisco to New York in the Autumn of 2011 – a run averaging 40 miles per day from sea to shining sea, that took 79 days in all.

Last summer, aged 64, Chris ran from John O' Groats to Land's End, becoming one of just a handful of athletes ever to complete this USA/UK double. Chris also holds the

World Record for the longest sub-3-hour marathon streak in the same marathon, having gone under 3 hours 33 times at the London Marathon every year since it began from 1981, until 2013. He has run every London Marathon since its inception, right up until 2023,

making a total of 43 races... so far!

Chris is married to Julia, who has run several marathons, including the London. Julia is a (sometime) runner and (very regular) volunteer at their local parkrun in Cranleigh.
