It is recognised that the judgements about what sacrifices a family should make to pay school fees will be personal and the level of awards is therefore not rigid. The award of a bursary is specifically to allow a child whose parents may not otherwise be able to afford tuition fees to benefit from a place at our school. The award is not intended to support a pre-existing lifestyle. The Governors therefore consider that the following would not be consistent with the award of a bursary:

- 1. Household income (gross income) in excess of £65,000
- 2. Net assets should not exceed £300,000
- 3. Substantial savings or investments of more than £60,000
- 4. Receipt of any means-tested State Benefit
- 5. If only one parent is employed (unless one is prevented from doing so through incapacity)
- 6. More than one property
- 7. Investment in significant home improvements
- 8. Mortgages on excessively expensive properties
- 9. Substantial equity in homes
- 10. Frequent or expensive holidays
- 11. New or luxury cars

Applicants are asked to submit a portfolio of recent work and should bring this to the school on the day of the Entrance Exam. After the work has been inspected, a shortlist of applicants will be invited to take part in an observed drawing exercise and a short interview with their portfolio of work.
